## Clean of the Month – Lindsay Road

We were asked by Trinity Factors to clean the rear elevation of their residential block in Edinburgh’s Newhaven area. Completed in 2013, the block is exposed to traffic pollutants as well as pollutants from the Firth of the Forth. In addition to this, several leaking downpipes had caused staining to the exterior and was beginning to give the housing block a tired and dated appearance. The high temperatures of the DOFF machine enabled us to remove the staining quickly and efficiently.

The DOFF can maintain its high temperatures when working at heights of up to 45m from the ground. This allows us to clean residential and commercial blocks without comprising on the results.



## Access Equipment Hire

At Keystone, we own all our plant and equipment, which includes two Spiderlifts – a narrow tracked boom lift designed to access areas where traditional cherry pickers can’t. It is often used in place of traditional and expensive scaffolding systems.

When we are not required to use such equipment to carry out works our access equipment is available for hire.
